

Millennium Garden

In 1999, the residents of Holme Pierrepont agreed to construct a landscaped seating area at the corner of Sanday's Lane and Holme Lane to mark the Millennium and, at the same time, tidy up an area which had previously been fly-tipped.

A legal agreement was drawn up by the landowners, Sidney Hackett and Sons, agreeing to the use of the land as a garden, in perpetuity. Tarmac carried out the work which included clearing the site, laying stone paving and building a low wall. The metal circular bench around the oak tree was made locally and installed by a resident. To mark the occasion, a plaque engraved with the names of the residents of the hamlet was installed on a stone block. The garden was opened on 24th June 2000 and since then has become a welcome resting place for walkers and cyclists.

Over the years the residents have maintained the garden. However, with the passage of time, the tree started to grow beyond the capacity of the seat causing damage to the trunk. Fortunately, the Parish Council stepped in and as a result the bench has now been modified. In addition, the Parish Council has agreed to take on the future care and maintenance of the garden so it can continue to be enjoyed by all those who pass by.

Friendship Benches

Thanks to a donation by Nottinghamshire County Councillor, Roger Upton, and a contribution from the Parish Council, two new friendship benches have been installed next to the Grantham Canal footpath in Gamston. Constructed by local firm, Gibbs Fabrications, the benches are made from galvanised steel which will dull over time to a darker grey.

It is hoped that the benches and the newly paved area for wheelchairs, will not only provide somewhere for people to rest and relax but also a space where they can sit and talk. Some people can go for days or even weeks without human contact and as the "happy to chat" bench idea has shown, even a simple "hello" can help tackle loneliness.

Dog Fouling

At the full council meeting on 7th July 2022, Rushcliffe Borough Council introduced new powers in a borough wide Dog Control Public Space Protection Order (PSPO). Dog owners in the borough, and hence in the parish, must now carry bags or have other means to pick up dog waste or face a possible £100 fine. Dog fouling causes many issues so if you are a dog owner, please ensure that you always have bags with you, that you pick up after your pet and dispose of the waste in one of the many dog bins located throughout the area.
