## Inspector's update – 14<sup>th</sup> June 2020

Welcome to the latest edition of the Rushcliffe Stakeholder Update. My name is Craig Berry and I am the officer responsible for the policing of Rushcliffe Borough.

Due to the current Covid-19 pandemic my two Sgts have not provided reports on this occasion, they are supervising the work around Covid-19 and other day to day business, which continues during the pandemic.

On Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> June our officers spotted a suspicious vehicle in Compton Acres, after a short pursuit the vehicle crashed and the two occupants fled on foot. We then utilised officers on the ground along with a dog officer and the Police drone to locate one of the males. Steven SUNDERLAND, 30 years of age from Waterdown Road in Nottingham was arrested and charged with aggravated vehicle taking, driving without insurance, handling stolen goods and driving otherwise than in accordance with a licence. The vehicle had previously been stolen from Bunny.

I mentioned in the previous stakeholders report about the work I have been doing around the issues of people gathering in the parks on Bridgford road at West Bridgford. During the weekend of the 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> of June the weather was such that we did not see people gathering in that area.

I have visited many of the licensed premises in that area and whilst many were not breaching their licensing conditions, one establishment received a written warning about their actions.

During the evening of Friday and Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> of June we had officers in the area on foot and engaged with the licensed premises and people that had gathered on the park. We found that people were adhering to the guidelines and had no issues from the licensed premises.

I am pleased to say that in the past 2 months our operation 'Alaska' around drugs activity has been very successful. We have executed seven search warrants resulting in significant amounts of class A and B drugs being seized. 14 Suspects have been interviewed in relation to drugs and money laundering offences. These types of offences do take some time to investigate fully, looking at mobile phone interrogation etc. but I am confident that we will get some successful outcomes.

I am sorry to hear about the A46 fatal road traffic collision (RTC) that occurred on Saturday evening, local officers were involved in the initial attendance and scene management.
