Inspector's update – 1st May 2020

Welcome to the latest edition of the Rushcliffe Stakeholder Update. My name is Craig Berry and I am the officer responsible for the policing of Rushcliffe Borough.

Due to the current Covid-19 pandemic my two Sgts have not provided reports on this occasion, they are supervising the work around Covid-19 and other day to day business.

As part of this I am pleased to advise that the local beat team assisted CID colleagues with the execution of a drugs warrant at an address in Edwalton.

More than 250 cannabis plants were found, a 21 year old male was arrested. CID officers are continuing the enquiry.

We have recorded a hate crime related assault where a Chinese woman had, what was thought to be beer, thrown at her as she cycled through Keyworth.

A 21 year old male has been interviewed and reported for summons in relation to this, he will be attending court in due course.

Our Rushcliffe beat team officers were on duty over the very warm Easter bank holiday weekend. Our role, as it has been since the restrictions were put into place, is to engage and advise people about the restrictions. The feedback that I have been getting is that generally our residents are adhering to the restrictions, which I thank them for.

I am aware that there have been a number of fires started in the area of Sharphill Woods in West Bridgford; local officers have been patrolling in those areas on a regular basis. Nottinghamshire fire and rescue have also issued warnings to residents about lighting bonfires which can quickly get out of control.

We have some very good support by Special Constables in the Rushcliffe area over the last few weeks; they have been providing a visible presence in many parts of Rushcliffe and will continue to do so.

Finally, we had reports yesterday of some old explosive devices being found on land between Cotgrave and Stanton on the Wolds. A controlled explosion was carried out on the items this morning. No persons have been injured.
