Neighbourhood Policing Inspector's update - June 2022



Good Afternoon Everyone

I hope you are all ok and enjoyed the Jubilee weekend.

The warmer weather is here and the amount of people out and about has increased a lot. This is great to see especially after the previous couple of years but with has come some issues that we have been asked to have a look at by yourselves and residents.

Parking....I could really do with your help with this. The Police don't have powers to deal with anyone parked on double yellow lines anymore but it is often about more drivers being more considerate and thinking of others. Would you be able to encourage your contacts and residents to be respectful when parking and avoid parking on pavements, especially around schools. It is so important there is a gap on pavements so anyone who needs to get past can safely do so.

Despite the numbers being low there has still been some sheds being broken into around Lady Bay with mostly push bikes being stolen. I am pleased to let you know that behind the scenes we have been working alongside our burglary team on CID to identify who was responsible. This person was arrested last week and charged with a number of these offences. We could not achieve outcomes such as this without the help of you all, the Local Authority and importantly our residents. Please keep encouraging reporting to the police via 101, 999 or now the online method via the internet. Despite this arrest I would still ask you to pass on my message of keeping your properties, outbuildings and vehicles secure. Many offenders on the area use an opportunistic method and this is reflected in the offences I see.

In the rural areas we have seen 3 GPS units taken from farm vehicles. I have already spoken with some of you about this but please let your neighbours and contacts know so that they can be removed or secured when left unattended. Both for the burglary, auto crime and rural crime offences there are additional patrols that I have put in place so please know we are there patrolling even during the night.
