## Inspector's update – 31<sup>st</sup> December 2019

Welcome to the latest edition of the Rushcliffe Stakeholder Update. My name is Craig Berry and I am the officer responsible for the policing of Rushcliffe Borough.

I would like to wish everyone a happy New Year and hope that you all had a peaceful and happy Christmas.

Many of our officers continued to work throughout the Christmas period and will also be working on New Year's Eve.

Some sad news recently reported on our social media and force web sites where two officers were assaulted in the early hours of the morning on 30/12/2019. This was whilst they were dealing with a Road Traffic Collision (RTC) in East Leake. We will do everything we can to support those officers.

Just a flavour of the types of incidents received by the force control room we were called to deal with on Christmas day and Boxing Day 2019.

### **Rushcliffe South area - 36 calls received**

4 X Abandoned calls, 1 X House alarm sounding, 1 X ASB (Anti -Social Behaviour), 1 X Dwelling burglary, 1 X Domestic incident/Mental health, 1 X Theft from shop, 3 x Violence against a person, 2 X RTC's. The rest were suspicious incidents or repeat reports of the same incidents.

### **Rushcliffe North area - 40 Calls received**

6 X Abandoned calls, 1 X House alarm sounding, 3 X ASB, 1 X Criminal damage/domestic incident, 5 x Domestic incidents, 4 X RTC's, 2 X Theft from shops, 1 X violence against the person. The rest were suspicious incidents or repeat reports of the same incidents.

Officers will have dealt with these incidents to a final conclusion or will continue the investigation at a later date.

The second Local Police Priority Setting meeting will take place in early January

# Team updates: West Bridgford

Our local officers have been carrying out patrols in the West Bridgford area in the lead up to Christmas; this has been around the night time economy times and earlier in the day when shop thefts have been more prevalent in past years.

The number of shop thefts this year was quite low in the run up to Christmas.

Autocrime offences reported in and around West Bridgford, since the last stakeholders report.

Three vehicles had registration plates stolen from them at various locations around West Bridgford.

Three vehicles where catalytic convertors were stolen, these were hybrid type vehicles.

Another vehicle had around £250 worth of goods stolen from it overnight.

Officers were quick to act when we received a report of a robbery having taken place on Rutland Road and short time later another robbery occurred in an alleyway near the Rushcliffe Arena. The officers who attended arrested a 17 year old boy on suspicion of those offences.

We have made some good progress in relation to the Local Police Priority Settings (LPPS) for the last 3 months.

# Team updates: Rushcliffe South

Wishing you all a happy New Year, unfortunately some of the Rushcliffe South residents became a victim of crime around the 20<sup>th</sup> to 21<sup>st</sup> of December in Bingham. A number of vehicles were broken into over that period. Many of these vehicles, which were commercial vans, were entered by forcing or drilling door locks. Commercial vehicles locks can be re-enforced to make this type of crime more difficult, or the addition of an alarm system in load carrying area.

Beat surgeries were held during the second half of December by PC Caroline VOCE and PCSO Tony DAVIES at Cropwell Bishop and East Leake respectively.

Since the last stakeholders report we have a mix of reported crimes on the south area of Rushcliffe, 17 of those were domestic related, each of those would have been attended by an officer with positive action and quite often referrals to our partner agencies where applicable.

We had a repeat report of Criminal damage being caused to some newly planted trees in Cropwell Butler, the damaged trees were replaced only for those to be damaged. Total damage value was a considerable amount of money, Investigations are on-going.

On the 21<sup>st</sup> of December we took a report of female being approached by a male offering to cut her hedge cutting, the male kept lowering the price until they finally agreed on £60, the cash was handed over in full, the male said he would return to complete the work. The male never returned to carry out the work as agreed. Details of how to deal with cold callers can be found on the Nottinghamshire Police web site under the heading of advice and then Crime Prevention Guides.

I am pleased to say that we have only been made aware of one ASB (Anti-social behaviour) issue around the Cotgrave precinct over the last 2 weeks; this is a big improvement from the October/November period.
