## Inspector's update – 9<sup>th</sup> April 2020

Welcome to the latest edition of the Rushcliffe Stakeholder Update. My name is Craig Berry and I am the officer responsible for the policing of Rushcliffe Borough.

Due to the current Covid-19 pandemic my 2 Sgts have not provided reports on this occasion, they are supervising the work around Covid-19.

You will have seen that we have been out patrolling the whole area of Rushcliffe, following the Chief Constables direction

Whilst it is 'business as usual' for Notts Police the local beat team are being visible in the area, engaging and ensuring people understand the restrictions that are in place.

With regards to the Local police priority setting meeting (LPPS), our priorities for both the Police and our partners for the next 3 months will be the Covid-19 patrols. This will be detailed on the Rushcliffe Neighbourhood beat areas of the Nottinghamshire Police web site as usual.

As part of our 'business as usual' role, local officers have recently executed a theft act search warrant (Theft from motor vehicles) in the Edwalton area, a 26 year old male was interviewed as a result of this work.

I have had some data from the Police and Crime Commissioners survey covering February to March 2020 which you may be interested in.

Of the 26% of survey respondents that have had contact with the police over the previous year those having had contact with the police, 58% said that they were very or fairly satisfied with the service they received, compared to 25% that were dissatisfied.

24% of respondents felt well informed about what the police were doing in their area, with the proportion having risen from 19% over the last year.
