Eric Henry Pell

Eric Henry Pell was born in Flawborough in Nottinghamshire in 1895.

In 1911, Eric the middle son of the three Pell brothers, who all served in the First World War, was living at Holme House with his parents, elder brother Joseph William aged 14, who was working on the family farm, younger brother Harold Whitt aged 13 years and still at school and sister Mary Elizabeth Hilary aged 7 years.

Eric enlisted as a private with the 11th Hussars on the 15th November 1915, was promoted to Sergeant, and by the 17th April 1916 he had been commissioned and ended the war as a Lieutenant.

He was gassed during the war and afterwards returned to continue working for his father on the family farm. In June 1920 he married Adelaine Elnor of

Notts. Farmer's Death

The death occurred at the week-end of Mr. Eric H. Pell, a well-known Notts. farmer, of Flawborough. Mr. Pell, 55 years old, was the son of the late Mr. W. H. Pell, of Holme House, Holme Pierrepont.

Mr. Pell was chairman of the council of Notts. Agricultural Society, president this year of the Flintham Ploughing Association, and he had been a
